A dash of Taj Mahal, a sprinkle of B.B. King and a few drops of Lighting Hopkins: stir it up, simmer on low an d you have a recipe that sounds like Brandon Isaak.

Crowds always leave Brandon's shows with a smile on their face and a need to come back for more. This Yuko n born songster performs a mixture of thoughtful, humorous, spiritual and catchy memorable songs; always del ivered with world class guitar, harmonica and vocals. Lyrics are paramount and it's obvious when you see his a ccolades and hear his music. After 35 years in the business, this international touring artist is always asked back as he's a total pro off and on the stage. If you like top notch blues, hard hitting lyrics and great night of entertain ment, Brandon Isaak is your man.

Brandon Isaak is a one of a kind world class roots and blues showman ! He engages with an audience, getting th em involved and part of the show. New fans are made at every show as they leave the venue still singing catchy l ines and humming new melodies. Brandon is a multi-instrumentalist who writes heartfelt, uplifting, funny and s piritual songs. This Yukon born artist takes his audiences on an emotional journey through the varieties of his o riginal songs. He has honed his craft over the past 37 years and it shows every night. His gravelly singing voice always astounds people that wonder how that big voice comes out of his smaller frame! He has played in three continents and 8 country's, as well as 13 European tours.

Brandon has been nominated for many awards including Maple Blues for song writing of the year, blues act of t he year, producer of the year, guitar player of the year, album of the year . He also 2 Juno nominations under his belt.

Gerber's career spans more than 40 years and is rich in modern music history. At the age of 15 he won a songwr iting contest and had two original songs recorded at the legendary Chess Studio. On the day he went in to record the studio was being painted — by recording artist Chuck Berry. "That was a real life lesson in the fickle nature of the music business," Gerber said.

Lured from university in 1965 by producer Paul Rothchild, Gerber became singer, songwriter and keyboardist f or the super-group Rhinoceros. With the release of two albums, Rhinoceros toured North America with the like s of Janis Joplin, BB King, Jefferson Airplane, Traffic, Jimi Hendrix, Steppenwolf and others.

Home for Gerber was the famed Chelsea Hotel with Andy Warhol and Janis Joplin as his fellow tenants.

Gerber left Rhinoceros and released his first solo effort in 1971 and toured with Leon Russell. He also placed t wo songs on the soundtrack of Bob Dylan's movie Renaldo and Clara.

For several years Alan lived in France and toured with his All Star American Blues Review before settling in Q uebec.

In 1994, he produced and released Chicken Walk. He followed that up with Fools That Try in 1997 and The Bo ogie Man in 1999.

When demand for a live CD began to surface, Alan took the studio on the road and produced Alan Gerber Live in 2002. In 2005 he released the critically acclaimed Blue Tube. His next CD, Queen of Hearts, included a due t with his teenage daughter Hannah and two songs nominated for the Grammy long-list in 2010.

Gerber's show is grounded in the blues, but has Appalachian style fiddling, slide guitar and gospel boogie woog ie on the piano thrown in.
