Literacy Tip: drawing and scribbling are an essential pre-writing skill. Children do not need to know how to pri nt letters or write words to write and tell a story. Eventually their scribbles will take on features of written text-moving from left to right on a page, going up for 'tall' letters (b, d, t) and lower for 'short' letters (a, c, e).

"Where else have we seen fish?". Questions like these may prompt your little one to make a text to self connection and/or share a story of their own. Such conversations will help your child connect more meaningfully to the story and will in turn , help foster a love of reading and storytelling.
